ABOUT THE PROJECT



The proposed solar and battery farm is located within the Bundaberg Regional Council area, Wide Bay Burnett Region.

The solar farm plans to use solar photovoltaic panels to generate up to 160MW of electrical energy.

The 200MW consolidated lithium-ion battery energy storage system is composed of individual batteries and inverters.

The facility is capable of both storing and exporting electrical energy and is electrically connected to the national grid (via a switch station).

INVESTMENT / JOBS



It is expected a peak construction workforce of about 200 skilled and unskilled workers, with an average of 60-80 onsite at any one time.

The project value is \$600 million.
